

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The following waste must **not** be mixed with other waste:

- **EE waste**  All electrical or electronic waste that normally uses electricity or batteries. For example: computer equipment, brown goods, white goods, cables, light sources and power tools
- **Radioactive waste**  Substances and products that are marked with the radioactivity symbol
- **Explosive waste**  Ammunition, dynamite, fuses, pressurised containers, fire extinguishers, fireworks and similar
- **Infectious waste**  Hypodermic needles and syringes, blood bags and laboratory waste, used bandages, nappies used by infected persons, blood-infected waste
- **Household organic waste**  Food waste and cooking oil
- **Hazardous waste**  Paints, solvents, waste oils, batteries, spray cans, glue, asbestos, windows containing PCBs or chloroparaffins, fluorescent tubes, cleaning agents, floor coverings containing phthalates, roofing felt, impregnated timber, building and demolition waste that may contain hazardous substances
- **Liquid waste**  Such as sewage sludge
- **Plaster**  Plasterboards and waste containing plaster
- **Tires**  With and without rims
- **Impregnated wood** 
- **Masses**  Concrete, soil, sand, stone, gravel, roofing tiles
- **Insulation** 

Do not fill the container too full

The container and Smartbag must not be loaded beyond their size/permissible weight. Masses can only be thrown in a small 5 m3 container.

Do not dispose of waste in black/colored rubbish bag

Garbage bags must be transparent so visual inspection is possible.
